| Public Health Programs Update | Rabies has been very busy this summer. Staff have fielded many calls regarding bats, especially in older homes including Airbnb's. We are noticing a trend of individuals taking in feral/stray cats/animals without updating or getting them rabies vaccinations. When a domestic animal is exposed to a rabid animal and has no rabies vaccination records, this results in a quarantine of the animal(s). We currently have 2 quarantines in progress, 1 dog and 1 involving multiple cats. In accordance with NYSDOH, our communicable disease program is currently reviewing plans for H5N1 avian influenza. H5N1 has been found in domestic poultry and wild birds. Currently the risk to humans is low and NYSDOH is monitoring the disease. | |

| | NYSDOH was conducting syphilis investigations for the 17-county region that Delaware County is a part of. These investigations will be the responsibility of (LHD) local health department staff beginning in January. Staff are currently undergoing training. Our Immunization program has a full schedule for our monthly immunization clinic, tomorrow. This is typical as children go back to school and need to up to date on required vaccinations. | |

| Children's Program Update | Early Intervention will be transitioning to a new statewide data system, EI-Hub. All staff/providers/agencies will need to complete training. The transition to a new system will be a big project as our staff will be learning the new system at the same time as trying to assist providers and agencies. Staff will be very busy as we continue to be down a staff member with a role of EI service coordinator. | |
| | Preschool has a high caseload at this time. Last year in September we had a caseload of 66. Currently we have a caseload of 84 with 38 students going to center-based programs. We are seeing a trend of kids born during the pandemic who were not part of the Early Intervention program and are now entering preschool needing multiple services and high needs. | |
| | Our CYSHCN program provided a sensory safe space at the Delaware County fair. This was a phenomenal success, serving a variety of age groups receiving wonderful feedback. We plan to host mini versions of this room in different locations throughout the year. | |
| PH Infrastructure Grant | The Public Health Infrastructure grant is a 5-year grant running through 2027. This grant will not fund capital improvements but can be used to improve our workspace to increase employee retention.
